Notes from the Nurse

We have seen a significant rise in cold symptoms this past week and would like to remind you that the guidelines for COVID testing remain consistent. Although we are not requiring masks, we still ask that you

keep your children home if they are exhibiting ANY cold, flu, or Covid symptoms:

- -Runny nose or congestion
- -Cough
- -Sore throat
- -Vomiting
- -Headache
- -Fever

If your child is having any of these symptoms, you still need to do a Covid test and provide me with the results prior to them being cleared to return to school. I still have a supply of rapid tests that I am happy to share with you if you do not have tests at home. 
